

Program Briefs

- 1. **SHG Formation and Nurturing**: Under the scheme of SGSY supported by DRDA, Nalanda, we have formed 325 groups of underprivileged women in Hilsa and Tharthari blocks in Nalanda district in Bihar. All the SHGs have saving accounts. About 80 percent of the SHGs have credit linkages under SGSY scheme. They are earning their livelihood through loans from banks and also repaying it successfully.
- 2. <u>Basic Orientation Training to SHGs</u>: So far, we have trained 395 SHGs in Ekangarsarai block in Nalanda district. In this training program, SHG members were

trained in maintenance of group norms, book keeping and accountancy. The program was supported by DRDA, Nalanda.

3. AXSHYA Project: We are implementing awareness programs on Tuberculosis with the support of MAMTA health institute for mother & child, New Delhi. Under the program, awareness interventions are organized through community meetings with Village Health and Sanitation Committee, PRI, Social Activists and Community Members on Tuberculosis, Collecting sputum of suspects, transportation of sputum for test to concern DMC and Co-ordinating with government hospitals /DMCs and DOTS Centre, Advocacy with TB patients and treatment of positive patients of tuberculosis.

4.Awareness Program against Kalazar&Malaria- The organization organized community meeting to aware the people against **Kalazar & Malaria** Using safe drinking water, using toilets and using monsquito nets, in different villages of Hilsa Block in Nalanda Distt, Bihar.

5.Total sanitation campaign: Under the scheme of total sanitation program, the awareness generation program on the safe drinking water, health and sanitation are organized in every villages of Tharthari block.9,556 low cost toilet is constructed for the poor people in this block for safe health. All beneficiaries are using toilet and the dirtiness of village is reduced.

6Health and family welfare program: We have organized a number of health check up camp and eye camp for disadvar — ed community of the society. Catract operation camps has been also organized for the oldest people by VISION PLUS organized by the organization. All cataract operated people are working themselves without the assistance of others In these camps 96 persons were examined by the eye specialist doctors at the same place. Under the scheme of health department, the organization has indentified 20,000 socially excluded family for getting the health card to avail the benefit of free health, check up, free consumption of medicine and all type of expenses done during the sickness period. Trevelling cost is also paid by the government by the effort of the organization to every household. 5000 children are immunized by the assistance of district health department. Women have faith on immunization of children and till now all immunized children are healthy.

7.Seminar-Organised seminar on right age marriage, Pregnancy delay and compulsory marriage registration for better health and to get benefits by government available for them. The organization also organized seminars on PCPNDT Act, Drinking water, Girl Health, Solar Energy, National Oil Seed, Climate change, Human rights, Bachan Ba o, Disabled welfare, Child labour, Litrecy Program, Asha worker, Farmers Training, Right to Information Watershed Development, Science & Technology, Health & Sanitation, Flood Disaster, Jute diversification, Beti Bachao Abhiyan, Save the children, Solar energy, Yoga naturopathy and Rural Development

- 8. Improving Reproductive and Sexual Health of Young People: Awareness camps are organized in the villages on the right age of marriage by explaining the disadvantages, loss of health and risk of life due to early marriages. This program is supported by MAMTA health institute for mother & child, New Delhi.
- 9.. <u>Crèche Program:</u> Under the scheme of Central Social Welfare Board, New Delhi, we are implementing 03 crèche centers for the benefits of children of the working women.
- 10.. NAEC: Organization is conducting awareness campaign under national awareness environmental campaign for last 10 years. The program is supported by Ministry of Environment & Forest, New Delhi.
- 11. Total Literacy Campaign: The organization has implemented Total Literacy Campaign in Hilsa block through "Zila Sakcharta Samiti, Nalanda" supported by National Literacy Authority Mission. So far 26,308 illiterate people in the age group of 15 to 35 years have become literate. On the basis of its excellent performance, the organization was awarded "Akshhar Shree Award" by the Chief Minister of Bihar on 7th March, 2008.
- 12.FORMATION OF FPO -Development of Fishieries Farmers through organisining Farmer Producer Organisation named "MATASYASHAY FISHERIES FARMER PRODUCER COMPANY PVT LTD" with support by "NABARD" till now two hundred and twenty five farmers are share holder partners managed by a dedicated Board of Directors. The company applied for Agricalture based Fertiliser, Seed and Insecticicide shop which is running smoothly for our company snare holders. The company organized for all the Fishery Farmers in Nalanda Distt.
- 13.Development of Minor and Landless Farmers Our Organisation organized minor and landless farmers in Five Villages and organized them for group farming for cash crops like vegetable, Mashrum Cultivation etc. The minor and landless farmers doesnot have Irigation system and other resources to cultivate their land which they have. Our Organisation is trying 14.Skill Development Program-Lok Sevashram Chiksaura have organized skill development training program in different trades like Shorthand Typing, Food Processing, Beautician, Pumpset-Generater Repairing, Sewing-Cutting, Soft Toys Making, Motor Vehicle Driving, Fetter Welder, Carpentry, Production of Vermi Compost, MASHRUM PRODUCTION through NABARD in Chiksaura to Thirty women farmers of JIVIKA Groups. They awarded stipend and certificate They also trained for MASHRUM PROCESSING and Marketing.
